| Sommario/riassunto      | Descartes' <i>The World</i> offers the most comprehensive vision of the nature of the world since Aristotle, and is crucial for an understanding of his later writings, in particular the <i>Meditations</i> and <i>Principles of Philosophy</i> . Above all, it provides an insight into how Descartes conceived of natural philosophy before he started to reformulate his doctrines in terms of a sceptically driven epistemology. Of its two parts, the <i>Treatise on Light</i> introduced the first comprehensive, quantitative version of a mechanistic natural philosophy, supplying a theory of matter, a physical optics, and a cosmology. The <i>Treatise on Man</i> provided the first comprehensive mechanist physiology. This volume also includes translations of material important for an understanding of the work: related sections from the <i>Dioptrics</i> and the <i>Meteors</i> , and an English translation of the complete text of <i>The Description of the Human Body</i> . |
