Sommario/riassunto	<p>After he died in the backseat of a Cadillac at the age of twenty-nine, Hank Williams—a frail, flawed man who had become country music's first real star—instantly morphed into its first tragic martyr. Six decades later, Mark Ribowsky now weaves together the first fully realized biography of Hank Williams in a generation.
