A host of critical thinkers populate the study, from Martin Heidegger and Herbert Marcuse criticism of technology's close relation

to capitalism, to media networks' actualising the Habermasian ideal of collective communicative action, Hands delineates the potentials and the pitfalls of a technologised politics. From anti-war activism, to global justice movements, peer production and 'Twitter' activism, we see how politics is being shaped by the new technological environment.
