Sommario/riassunto	This study breaks new ground by examining the profoundly submissive and masochistic posture toward women exhibited by many of Hemingway's heroes, from Jake Barnes in <i>The Sun Also Rises</i> to David Bourne in <i>The Garden of Eden</i> . The discussion draws on the ideas of diverse authors revealing that 'masochistic aesthetic' informs many of the texts.
