Over 850 burials from throughout the southern Levant are examined to illustrate the Judahite form of burial and its development. Vessels for foods and liquids were of paramount importance in the

afterlife, followed by jewellery with its protective powers. The cult of

the dead began to be an unacceptable feature of the Jerusalem Yahwistic cult in the late eighth to seventh century BC
