Sommario/riassunto	One of the most famous anagrams of all time was constructed in the Middle Ages. The unknown author contrived it as a Latin dialogue between Pilate and Jesus. Jesus' answer to Pilate's question ""What is truth?"" is phrased as an ingenious anagram of the letters of that very question: Pilate: Quid est veritas? (""What is truth?""") Jesus: Est virqui adest.
