It is also a classic example of a U.S. military operation that drew in America's hemispheric allies. Finally, its outcome was that rare feat in the annals of diplomacy -- a peaceful political settlement of a civil war. Here for the first time is the

full story of that action, as told by one of its leading participants.

General Palmer was the U.S. Army's operations chief in Washington in April 1965 when the Dominic
