At the outset of independence 18 years ago, Kazakhstan's leaders Sommario/riassunto

promisedthat the country's rich natural resources, with oil and das reserves among thelargest in the world, would soon bring economic prosperity. It appeared that democracy was beginning to take hold in this newly independent state. Nearly twodecades later, Kazakhstan has achieved the World Bank's ranking of a ""middleeconomic country,"" but its economy is straining from the global economic crisis.
