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Sommario/riassunto	This paper explains how Iran developed its nuclear programme to the point where it threatens to achieve a weapons capability within a short time frame, and analyses Western policy responses aimed at forestalling that capability. Key questions are addressed: will the world

For nearly two decades, Western strategy on the Iran nuclear issue emphasised denial of supply.
