Sommario/riassunto	Critics and scholars have long argued that the Renaissance was the period that gave rise to the modern individual. The Gargantuan Polity examines political, legal, theological, and literary texts in the late Middle Ages, to show how individuals were defined by contracts of mutual obligation, which allowed rulers to hold power due to approval

of their subjects. Noting how the relationship between rulers and individuals changed with the rise of absolute monarchy, Michael Randall provides significant insight into Renaissance culture and politics by showing how individuals went from being understood in terms of their objective relations with the community to subjective beings. By studying this evolution, he challenges the argument that subjectivity enabled modern political autonomy to come into existence, and instead argues that subjectivity might have disempowered the outwardly directed and highly political individuals of the late Middle Ages. A profound and detailed study of one of the most drastic periods of change, *The Gargantuan Polity* will be of interest to scholars of French literature, the Renaissance, and intellectual history.

Sommario/riassunto	Le cycle de Guiron le Courtois, compose sans doute a partir de 1230 et en plusieurs etapes, est le dernier grand roman arthurien en prose francaise a rester inedit. Guiron le Courtois consiste en effet en plusieurs œuvres caracterisee par une tradition textuelle complexe : le Meliadus, le Roman de Guiron et la Suite Guiron. Le Meliadus et le Guiron ont ete concus independamment l'un de l'autre ; en outre, dans leur etat initial, ils n'ont sans doute jamais ete acheves, ce qui explique la tradition textuelle assez eclatee et, en particulier, la multitude de « raccords » et de « suites » destines a combler les interstices. Une edition critique de l'ensemble du cycle est actuellement en cours. Ceci

est le premier volume du Roman de Guiron propre, qui en comportera trois. Le texte est precede d'une introduction, comportant la description des manuscrits, une analyse de la tradition textuelle, une etude litteraire, un examen de la langue du manuscrit. Il est suivi de notes, d'un glossaire et d'un index des noms propres.
