Sommario/riassunto

De quoi les enfants souffrent-ils ? Où les soigner et les accueillir ? Comment et quand les vacciner ? Dans la théorie et la pratique médicales, le souci de l'enfance a une histoire, non linéaire et aux multiples facettes, que ce livre veut explorer. Il montre, à travers une série d'éclairages variés et détaillés, la manière dont la conscience d'une spécificité de l'enfant a contribué à modeler la médecine depuis l'époque moderne. Les enfants sont tour à tour, de la part des parents, des médecins ou de l'État, objets de curiosité scientifique, de sollicitude ou encore d'inquiétude. Des études savantes, que viennent enrichir les témoignages de deux médecins, font se croiser l'histoire de la pensée médicale, des pratiques vaccinales, de l'architecture hospitalière et des institutions de la santé publique. Les textes de cet ouvrage sont issus d'un colloque tenu en septembre 2018 à l'Université de Picardie Jules Verne et à l'Académie nationale de médecine. What do children suffer from? Where to look after them and welcome them? How and when to vaccinate them? In medical theory and practice, concern for childhood has a multifaceted, non-linear history that this book seeks to explore.

Sommario/riassunto	Getting Ahead tells the compelling stories of Latin-American immigrant women living in public housing in two Boston-area neighborhoods. Silvia Domínguez argues that these immigrant women parlay social ties that provide support and leverage to develop networks and achieve social positioning to get ahead. Through a rich ethnographic account and in-depth interviews, the strong voices of these women demonstrate how they successfully negotiate the world and achieve social mobility through their own individual agency, skillfully navigating both constraints and opportunities. Domínguez makes it clear that many immigrant women are able to develop the social support needed for a rich social life, and leverage ties that open options for them to develop their social and human capital. However, she also shows that factors such as neighborhood and domestic violence and the unavailability of social services leave many women without the ability to

strategize towards social mobility. Ultimately, Domínguez makes important local and international policy recommendations on issue ranging from public housing to world labor visas, demonstrating how policy can help to improve the lives of these and other low-income people.
