Ces documents de la pratique, relativement peu exploités jusqu'ici en histoire financière romaine, sont des sources exceptionnelles puisqu'ils permettent d'écrire une véritable histoire du développement du marché du crédit dans la longue durée, depuis la conquête de l'Égypte en 30 avant J.-C. qui transforme l'économie monétaire égyptienne, en passant par la mise en place progressive d'un système de rédaction et d'enregistrement des contrats privés particulièrement sophistiqué, jusqu'au grand bouleversement inflationniste qui frappe l'Empire à partir de 275 après J.-C. et qui ouvre une nouvelle ère dans l'histoire de l'économie monétaire de la province.

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Sommario/riassunto	Radicalization is a major challenge of contemporary global security. It conjures up images of violent ideologies, "homegrown" terrorists and jihad in both the academic sphere and among security and defense experts. While the first instances of religious radicalization were initially limited to second-generation Muslim immigrants, significant changes are currently impacting this phenomenon. Technology is said to amplify the dissemination of radicalism, though there remains uncertainty as to the exact weight of technology on radical behaviors.
