	Sommario/riassunto	The severity of interconnected socio-economic and environmental impacts on landscapes and people across Africa are exacerbated as a result of land degradation, conflict, poor governance, competition for land and inequality, and exacerbated by climate change. In pursuing pathways towards a more resilient future, collaborative and multi- stakeholder governance and management of landscapes have been promoted by government agencies, NGOs and conservation organisations as a possible solution.
