"This is the Office of the Inspector General's (OIG) sixth review examining the ability of federal law enforcement and immigration authorities to share automated fingerprint identification information. In this report, we describe the progress since December 2004 toward achieving full interoperability between two automated fingerprint systems: the Federal Bureau of Investigation's (FBI) Integrated Automated Fingerprint Identification System (IAFIS) and the Department of Homeland Security;s (DHS) Automated Biometric Identification (IDENT). We also describe the DHS's efforts to make its United States Visitor and Immigration Status Indicator Technology (US-VISIT) system interoperable with IAFIS.
