Sommario/riassunto

L'ambition de cet ouvrage est de reformuler, sous plusieurs éclairages, une question universelle : celle de la reconnaissance et de la consécration des objets culturels que sont les œuvres littéraires et les langues qui les portent. Il s'agit d'explorer les mécanismes d'élaboration d'un statut institué aussi bien du texte écrit que de la figure de l'écrivain à travers les concepts de légitimité et de légitimation. La réflexion porte sur des corpus littéraires situés sur des aires géographiques variés et à différentes époques de l'histoire. Cette problématique, qui intéresse plusieurs domaines (littérature, linguistique, sociologie, histoire, philosophie), gagne à être abordée de manière interdisciplinaire. L'œuvre littéraire est un produit social dont le succès dépend des lieux de pouvoir qui travaillent la société et de ce que Pierre Bourdieu appelle « le marché des biens symboliques ». Deux pôles en délimitent la vie et la visibilité : la production et la réception. L'écrivain et le lecteur participent, ensemble, à l'institution du dispositif métajuridique d'un pouvoir implicitement consensuel qui met sous son autorité et l'œuvre et la figure de l'auteur, pour leur conférer légitimité et validité selon des normes sociales, linguistiques et littéraires canonisées, qui inscrivent des œuvres et des artistes au panthéon du savoir. Les processus de légitimation convergent vers des enjeux de pouvoir même si, explicitement, le critère esthétique semble être privilégié parmi les paramètres de valorisation. Problématiser les notions de légitimité et de légitimation ne veut pas dire seulement faire l'inventaire des processus de reconnaissance par lesquels l'écrivain se voit investi d'une valeur qui le distingue d'abord, analyser les modes et les modèles opératoires dans le champ de la reconnaissance où le pouvoir se fait un allié sûr du savoir en le cautionnant et même en le produisant.

Sommario/riassunto	<p>The main argument is that improving migrants' rights and conceptual linkages between SSG/R and migration is best achieved, by decentring our gaze, namely going beyond the 'national' and 'state-centric' view that characterizes traditionally SSG/R and to consider the agency of both migrants and SSR actors. First from a migrants' perspective, it is key for SSR actors to go beyond traditional legal classifications and to consider the diversity of personal situations that involve refugees, stranded migrants and asylum seekers, which might endorse different roles at different times of their journeys and lives. Second, the transnational nature of migration calls for a transnationalization of SSG/R too. For too long the concept has mostly been applied within the national setting of SSR institutions and actors. Migration calls for a clear decentring that involves a transnational dimension and more work among transnational actors and policymakers to facilitate a norm transfer from the domestic to the interstate and international level. As such, the 'transnational' nature of migration and its governance needs to be 'domesticated' within the national context in order to change the mindset of SSG/R actors and institutions. More importantly, the paper argues that poor SSG/R at home produces refugees and incentivizes migrants to leave their countries after being victims of violence by law enforcement and security services. During migrants' complex and</p>

fragmented journeys, good security sector governance is fundamental to address key challenges faced by these vulnerable groups. I also argue that a better understanding of migrants' and refugees' security needs is beneficial and central to the good governance of the security sector. After reviewing the key terms of migration and its drivers in section 2, section 3 reviews how SSG is part of the implementation of the GCM. SSR actors play a role in shaping migratory routes and refugees' incentives to leave, in explaining migrants' and refugees' resilience, in protecting migrants and refugees, and in providing security. Although it cautions against artificial classifications and the term of 'transit migration', section 4 reviews what the core challenges are in the countries of origin, transit and destination. Section 5 provides a detailed overview of the linkages between migration and each security actor: the military, police forces, intelligence services, border guards, interior ministries, private actors, criminal justice, parliaments, independent oversight bodies and civil society. Section 6 formulates some recommendations.

Sommario/riassunto	The peroxisome is an organelle with essential roles in lipid metabolism, maintenance of reactive oxygen species homeostasis, and anaplerotic replenishment of tricarboxylic acid cycle intermediates destined for mitochondria. Peroxisomes constitute a dynamic endomembrane

system. The homeostatic state of this system is upheld via two pathways for assembling and maintaining the diverse peroxisomal compartments constituting it; the relative contribution of each pathway to preserving such system may vary in different organisms and under various physiological conditions. One pathway begins with the targeting of certain peroxisomal membrane proteins to an endoplasmic reticulum template and their exit from the template via pre-peroxisomal carriers; these carriers mature into metabolically active peroxisomes containing the entire complement of membrane and matrix proteins. Another pathway operates via growth and maturation of pre-existing peroxisomal precursors that do not originate from the endoplasmic reticulum; mature peroxisomes proliferate by undergoing fission. Recent studies have uncovered new roles for the peroxisomal endomembrane system in orchestrating important developmental decisions and defining organismal longevity. This *Frontiers Special Topic Issue* is focused on the advances in our understanding of how evolutionarily distant organisms coordinate the formation, maturation, proliferation, maintenance, inheritance and quality control of the peroxisomal endomembrane system and how peroxisomal endomembranes communicate with other cellular compartments to orchestrate complex biological processes and various developmental programs from inside the cell.
