For this study, 36 native Spanish speaking EFL learners at different proficiency levels were asked to respond in English to 24 different situations that called for the speech acts of request and apology. Results showed three important aspects. The first finding

suggested that basic adult learners possess a pragmatic knowledge in

their L1 that allows them to focus on the intended m
