Sommario/riassunto	Why is it that when we speak of three human subjects, we speak of a unique nature, but we say that they are "three men", while when we speak of the Trinity, we speak again of a unique nature, but we say that they are "one God"? Gregory of Nyssa gives the answer in his <i>Ad Ablabium</i> , work that lately is the focus of a discussion about the interpretation of Gregory's thought and the social analogy of the Trinity. <i>Trinity and Man</i> is the first monograph devoted entirely to this tract and contributes to the debate, offering a commentary to the text, which follows the development of the Nyssian arguments and frames them in the context of Gregory's theological grammar.
