The final chapter includes reference to optimal approaches to patient management, including patient

empowerment. To ensure that the whole clinical spectrum of autoimmune liver disease is covered, each chapter is jointly covered by contributing authors who are clinicians caring for adult, transitional and paediatric patients"--
