Sommario/riassunto	Comment ecrire l'histoire animale, c'est-a-dire du cote des animaux ? Cette interrogation en amene aussitot une seconde : cette histoire animale, avec quels documents la batir ? L'experience montre que la question des sources et de leur traitement est l'obstacle premier a une approche animale, l'aspect qui, avec le croisement disciplinaire, intimide le plus les chercheurs volontaires. Cette affaire forme deja barrage pour les disciplines aux documents imposes, constraints, restreints comme l'archeozoologie, la genetique historique, l'histoire, la litterature qui, souvent, sont obligees d'adapter leur demarche a ce qui reste. Mais, meme les disciplines comme l'ethnologie ou la sociologie, qui construisent d'abord leur problematique, leur epistemologie pour choisir ensuite leurs sources parmi les multiples possibles, butent sur l'« avec quoi ? » et le « comment faire ? » parce qu'elles n'en ont pas l'habitude. Que le lecteur soit rassure : ce livre n'est pas un fastidieux repertoire de sources, mais un traite pratique des methodes a employer, de facon a reflechir a l'« avec quoi ? », a montrer et a suggerer des pistes et des manieres de faire, a encourager les initiatives, tout en donnant l'occasion de penser concretement les programmes, les problematiques, les epistemologies. Parce que l'histoire animale est entendue non comme une discipline mais comme un dynamisme dans le temps et l'espace, d'hier et d'aujourd'hui, ce livre s'adresse aux archeologues et aux historiens, tout autant qu'aux

geographes, aux litteraires, aux ethnologues, aux sociologues, aux philosophes, ou encore aux paleogeneticien, aux ethologues et aux veterinaires. Et aux passionnes d'animaux.

Sommario/riassunto

This volume comprehensively examines how metropolitan Britons spoke and wrote about the British Empire during the short eighteenth century, from about 1730 to 1790. The work argues that following several decades of largely uncritical celebration of the empire as a vibrant commercial entity that had made Britain prosperous and powerful, a growing familiarity with the character of overseas territories and their inhabitants during and after the Seven Years' War produced a substantial critique of empire. This critique evolved out of a widespread revulsion against the behaviours exhibited by Britons overseas and built on a language of 'otherness' that metropolitans had used since the beginning of overseas expansion to describe its participants, the societies and polities that Britons abroad constructed in their new habitats. It used the languages of humanity and justice as standards to evaluate and condemn the behaviours of both overseas Britons and subaltern people in the British Empire, whether in India, the Americas, Africa or Ireland.
