Sommario/riassunto	In the years before and after World War II, there were no bigger voices than those of the Andrews Sisters. Maxene, LaVerne, and Patty charted more top ten Billboard hits than Elvis or the Beatles and went on to become the top-selling female vocal group of all time, selling approximately 100 million records. They recorded such instant hits as ""Beer Barrel Polka,"" ""Boogie Woogie Bugle Boy,"" ""Don't Fence Me In,"" and ""I Can Dream, Can't I?"" They dominated the music scene for fifteen years with some 600 recordings, appearances in seventeen films, cabaret performances, and countless radio an
