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Sommario/riassunto

This book provides a transnational African perspective on business management concerns and business ethics by examining the concepts of responsible business practices and sustainability across sub-Saharan Africa. It will also be a helpful guide for professionals and business owners to understand some salient issues in navigating sustainable business practices in Africa.
