Sommario/riassunto	Breaking Protocol tells the story of the first female ambassadors in US history (1933-1964): Ruth Bryan Owen, Florence Jaffray Harriman, Perle S. Mesta, Eugenie M. This is the first group biography of the Big Six, one that places these women in a wider historical context based on deep and broad research in archival sources.
