Since the early 1970's, southeastern archaeologists have focused their attention on identifying the function of prehistoric sites and settlement practices

during the Early Archaic period (ca. 9,000-10,500 B.P.). The Hardaway

site in the North Carolina Piedmont, one of the most important archaeological sites in eastern North America, has not yet figured
