As with the previous edition, the third edition integrates Native American childrearing philosophies and Western psychology to create a unique alternative for reaching troubled youth. Brendtro, Brokenleg, and Bockern introduce the Circle of Courage and its four values--(1) belonging, (2) mastery, (3) independence, and (4) generosity--as the model for reclaiming disconnected and lost youth.
