Sommario/riassunto	Cynthia prima fuit, Cynthia finis erit : Cynthia fut la première, Cynthia sera la dernière. Dans son quatrième et dernier recueil, Propertius réalise sa promesse : il inscrit le tombeau de son unique amante au cœur d'une Rome impériale transfigurée par l'élégie. L'adieu à l'amour, à la fin du livre III, et le ralliement impromptu du poète à l'Empire ne sont que les pénultièmes péripéties d'une aventure qui précèdent de peu l'apothéose de l'héroïne : dans le livre IV, fallax opus, œuvre trompeuse, Propertius subvertit le motif de l'immortalisation par la poésie des héros guerriers au profit de sa maîtresse, une femme légère comme le genre qu'elle incarne. « Plaisant paradoxe » selon Paul Veyne, l'élégie est aussi l'écriture, mêlée de joie et d'inquiétude, d'une audace nouvelle : l'esclavage amoureux libère la poésie qui devient nécessairement personnelle et subjective. Si l'amour sine modo, l'amour sans mesure, fou par fidélité, affidé par folie, ne se dit pas dans la transparence d'une écriture sincère, il demeure le signifié d'une authentique déclaration : celle d'un poète mauvais genre qui, contre toute la

tradition, le pouvoir et même la loi, réclame le droit d'aimer et de le dire. Il lui faut pour cela développer un paradoxe, en même temps plaisant et sérieux : la recusatio de l'épopée, refus dramatisé du genre noble et du chant patriotique, est, dans la Rome d'Auguste, une épreuve digne d'un héros épique.

Sommario/riassunto

This book presents an English translation, by Nicolas and Lamiell, of the entirety of a German-language text authored by William Stern (1871-1938) and published in 1900. Its publication is widely considered to mark the founding of that sub-discipline of psychology devoted to the systematic study of individual and group differences. The book includes an introductory chapter by Nicolas and Lamiell, placing Stern's work into historical context and discussing its influence on the work of scholars who followed. By making this work available for the first time for an Anglophone audience, it fills a significant gap in the history of psychology literature and offers a springboard into much needed critical discourse on the contemporary state of psychological testing in particular, and on the study of individual and group differences more broadly. It holds fresh insights for those specializing in the fields of personality psychology, educational psychology, and industrial-organizational psychology; as well as to practitioners in the fields of personal and educational counseling. L. William Stern (1871 – 1938) was a German scholar whose hallmark contribution to psychology was, in his own view, a comprehensive system of thought he called 'critical personalism.' Within that system, Stern offered a philosophically sophisticated understanding of the psychological development of human personalities and, by extension, a vision of the dynamics of socio-ethically flourishing human communities. Sommario/riassunto	This book focuses on the use of various molecules with antioxidant properties in the treatment of major male genital tract disorders, especially male infertility, erectile dysfunction, and accessory gland infection. The coverage also includes discussion of pathophysiology, the molecular basis of male infertility, and the rationale for use of antioxidants, with particular attention to coenzyme Q10 and carnitine. Oxidative stress occurs when the production of reactive oxygen species, including free radicals, exceeds the body's natural antioxidant defences, leading to cellular damage. Oxidative stress is present in about half of all infertile men, and reactive oxygen species can produce infertility both by damaging the sperm membrane, with consequences for sperm motility, and by altering the sperm DNA. There is consequently a clear rationale for the use of antioxidant treatments within andrology, and various in vitro and in vivo studies have indicated that many antioxidants indeed have beneficial impacts. In providing a detailed and up-to-date overview of the subject, this book will be of interest to both practitioners and researchers in andrology, endocrinology, and urology.
