Sommario/riassunto	This book, an official Spanish version of the World Health Organization's work on mental health crisis services, advocates for person-centered and rights-based approaches in mental health care. It highlights the global struggle to provide quality support for individuals facing mental health challenges while respecting their rights and dignity. The text emphasizes the need for reform to protect human rights in mental health, in line with the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities and the Sustainable Development Goals. It provides a roadmap for countries to develop community-based mental health services that reject coercive practices and promote individual autonomy and community inclusion. The book is intended for

policymakers, service providers, civil society, and individuals with mental health issues, aiming to inspire systemic changes in mental health care aligned with human rights standards.
