Sommario/riassunto

This book traces the emergence of British colonial administration in West Africa during the long eighteenth century through analysis of colonial archival documents, such as the African-British Treaties and the Reports of the British Sierra Leone Company, and concludes with analysis of *The Last Harmattan of Alusine Dunbar* by Syl Cheney-Coker, a postcolonial novel that examines the eighteenth century period.
