Sommario/riassunto	Within a few short months in 1997, Asian economies that had been considered not only healthy but ""miraculous"" suddenly fell off a precipice as investors withdrew massively first from Asian currencies and, in rapid order, from equity markets across the region. On October

27 1997, the turmoil in Asian markets spooked Wall Street in the largest single-day decline in history, a drop of 550 points.
