Sommario/riassunto	Swindall examines the historical and political context of acclaimed African American actor Paul Robeson's three portrayals of Shakespeare's Othello in the UK and the US: in London in 1930, on Broadway in 1943, and in Stratford-upon-Avon in 1959. All three of the productions, when considered together, provide an intriguing glimpse into Robeson's artistry as well as his political activism. The book maintains that Robeson's development into a politically minded artist explicates the broader issue of the role of the African American artist in times of crisis.
