And each year historians find something new and important to say about the greatest of our Presidents. *Lincoln Revisited* is a masterly guide to what's new and what's noteworthy in this unfolding story—a brilliant gathering of fresh scholarship by the leading Lincoln historians of our time. Brought together by The Lincoln Forum, they tackle uncharted territory and emerging questions; they also take a new look at established debates—including those about their own landmark works.
