policy advice, especially on budget formulation, which is the main focus

Sommario/riassunto

With limited natural resources, a crippling illiteracy rate, and high population growth, Yemen faces an array of daunting development challenges that some observers believe make it at risk for becoming a failed state. As the country's population rapidly rises, resources dwindle, and terrorist groups take root in the outlying provinces, the Obama
