Sommario/riassunto	Les sites web dits « pro-ana », lieux de rencontres pour des personnes atteintes d'anorexie ou d'autres troubles alimentaires, sont accusés d'encourager à la maigreur extrême. Mais leurs auteurs, commentateurs et lecteurs ont longtemps échappé au regard, si bien que leurs motivations et interactions restaient opaques. Ce livre lève le voile sur ces internautes et leurs réseaux sociaux. Et si le « pro-ana » était moins un effet indésirable de la parole libérée sur internet que le symptôme des transformations actuelles de notre manière de vivre la santé ? Face aux coupes dans les dépenses de santé publique, les

patients sont confrontés à l'injonction d'être actifs, informés, équipés. Mais la pression sociale qui en dérive peut engendrer des comportements paradoxaux et des prises de risque. L'étude que relate ce livre défie les idées reçues : en ligne, la valorisation de la maigreur est loin de faire l'unanimité, alors que se forment des réseaux d'entraide et d'information, visant à contrer l'isolement et à pallier les manques ressentis du système de soins.

Sommario/riassunto

One of Japan's most important intellectuals, Nambara Shigeru defended Tokyo Imperial University against its rightist critics and opposed Japan's war. His poetic diary (1936D1945), published only after the war, documents his profound disaffection. In 1945 Nambara became president of Tokyo University and was an eloquent and ardent spokesman for academic freedom. In this first English-language collection of his key work, historian and translator Richard H. Minear introduces Nambara's career and thinking before presenting translations of the most important of Nambara's essays, poems, and speeches.
