Sommario/riassunto

This book makes a consciously positive case for the civic value of the humanities. By embedding values from humanities subjects more deeply within universities, she argues that we can bring heart and soul, and indeed humanity, to higher education settings which have a far reaching, positive impact within and beyond these settings.
