created through interconnectedness). The goal of the book is not to

argue that one approach is better than another. It is to propose a strategy for creating coherent and congruent research that aligns values, purpose, process and product. Andeline dos Santos co-directs the music therapy Masters program at the University of Pretoria. She is author of Empathy pathways: A view from music therapy (Palgrave Macmillan, 2022), (with Co-Editor-in-Chief of the open-access music therapy journal Approaches: An Interdisciplinary Journal of Music Therapy and an associate editor for the Nordic Journal of Music Therapy.
