Sommario/riassunto	Kord and Krimmer investigate the most common male types - cops, killers, fathers, cowboys, superheroes, spies, soldiers, rogues, lovers, and losers - by tracing changing concepts of masculinity in popular Hollywood blockbusters from 1992 to 2008 - the Clinton and Bush eras - against a backdrop of contemporary political events, social developments, and popular American myths. Their in-depth analysis of over sixty films, from <i>The Matrix</i> and <i>Iron Man</i> to <i>Pirates of the Caribbean</i> and <i>The Lord of the Rings</i> , shows that movies, far from being mere entertainment, respond directly to today's social and political realities, from consumerism to "family values" to the War on

Terror.
