The chapter on India discusses in detail Panini's (c. 400 B.C.) grammar *Ast-adhy-ay-i* as well as the work of his commentators Katyayana, Patanjali, and Bhartrhari. In the Chinese tradition, the Confucian doctrine of the Rectification of Names' is singled out for treatment.
