Sommario/riassunto	<p>Daniel Schlumberger, archaeologist and art historian, worked from 1925 to 1972 from Lebanon and Syria to Afghanistan. He revealed the depth of the impact of Greek civilization and art in the East, from the Mediterranean to India, and brought to light the greatness of the Kushan civilization. He was successively member of the service of Antiquities of Syria and Lebanon, director of the French Archaeological Delegation in Afghanistan, professor at the University of Strasbourg then director of the French Institute of Archeology in Beirut.
