Another issue of the 1641 edition of Leicesters ghost appears on reel 259:E.197, no. 3 as Wing R1837A. "First printed abroad, under the title of 'A dialogue between a scholar, a gentleman, and a lawyer,' &c. From the colour of its leaves, it was called 'Father Parson's green-coat'.
