De pacatissimo Angliæ statu, imperante Elisabetha, compensiosa narratio" (first word in Greek characters), and "Alexandri Neuilli Kettus, siue de furoribus Norfolcensium Ketto duce liber vnu" each have separate dated title page; the latter is paginated; register is continuous. Includes index. In this edition N1v last line begins "ni ex". Sheets are sometimes mixed with STC 18773-4. Identified as STC 18773a on UMI microfilm reel 675.
