Sommario/riassunto

La supervision professionnelle est reconnue au sein des institutions
comme utile aux professionnels du travail social et de la santé, tant
dans leurs fonctions d'aide et de soutien à des tiers, que dans leur vécu
institutionnel ou inter-professionnel. Pourtant, depuis quelques
années, la complexité croissante du fonctionnement institutionnel, le
durcissement des conditions de travail et l'instauration massive de
logiques de management ont provoqué l'émergence d'une nouvelle
pratique comme alternative à la supervision : l'intervention
institutionnelle. Il s'agit d'identifier les changements nécessaires et de
les mener à bien. L'intervenant devient un leader qui permet la

Véritable outil de travail, ce livre propose une méthodologie en cinq étapes, et pour chacune de ces étapes une fiche récapitulative ainsi que des exemples concrets.
