The first two title pages have printers' device (McK. 274), the last a port. of Elizabeth I; paging and register are continuous. The first part is by John Higgins, who signs the dedication; the second part is by Thomas Blenerhasset; the third part by William Baldwin, and the separate part "Englands Eliza" is by Richard Niccols, who edited the whole. Cf. ESTC.
