Sommario/riassunto	This book is an extended version of Professor Jasper Krommendijk's inaugural lecture at Radboud University. It examines the effectiveness of human rights within a multilevel legal order amidst growing skepticism and criticism from various factions, including politicians, academics, and the public. Krommendijk argues for the necessity of both legal doctrinal and empirical research to understand when and why human rights are effective. The text explores the complexity of the multilevel human rights order and emphasizes the importance of

safeguarding human rights through rigorous research. It serves as a critical resource for scholars, legal practitioners, and anyone invested in the future of human rights.
