Sommario/riassunto	2.1 Text Summarization “Text summarization is the process of distilling the most important information from a source (or sources) to produce an abridged version for a particular user (or users) and task (or tasks)” [3]. Basic and classical articles in text summarization appear in “Advances in automatic text summarization” [3]. A literature survey on information extraction and text summarization is given by Zechner [7].

In general, the process of automatic text summarization is divided into three stages: (1) analysis of the given text, (2) summarization of the text, (3) presentation of the summary in a suitable output form. Titles, abstracts and keywords are the most common summaries in Academic papers. Usually, the title, the abstract and the keywords are the first, second, and third parts of an Academic paper, respectively. The title usually describes the main issue discussed in the study and the abstract presents the reader a short description of the background, the study and its results. A keyword is either a single word (unigram), e.g.: 'learning', or a collocation, which means a group of two or more words, representing an important concept, e.g.: 'machine learning', 'natural language processing'. Retrieving collocations from text was examined by Smadja [5] and automatic extraction of collocations was examined by Kita et al. [1].

Sommario/riassunto

Dies ist die erste vollständige Übersicht über alles, was das antike Judentum an griechischen Texten anonymer, pseudepigrapher oder fragmentarischer Art hinterlassen hat, einschließlich der Übersetzungen in westliche oder orientalische Sprachen. Jede Schrift wird nach den Regeln der Einleitungswissenschaft identifiziert und auf Ursprache, Authentizität und literarisches Werden geprüft. Es werden Hinweise gegeben für ein zeitgenössisches Verständnis. Zutage tritt eine gezielte Publizistik, v.a. hinter den in Judäa lokalisierbaren Veröffentlichungen; sie hat die mittelmeerische Diaspora auf Griechisch versorgt und die östliche auf Aramäisch. Es zeigen sich die Grundlinien einer – bis jetzt ungeschriebenen – Literaturgeschichte des vorrabbinischen Judentums. Kritische Aufmerksamkeit gilt den christlichen Veränderungen. Der "Sitz im Leben" vieler Texte hat sich bei der Übernahme ins Christentum (wo sie allein erhalten blieben) entscheidend geändert.

This is the first complete overview of all anonymous, pseudepigraphic, and fragmentary Greek textual sources handed down from ancient Judaism, including translations into Western or Eastern languages. Each text is described according to the rules of scholarly introduction and checked for its original language, authenticity, and literary genesis. Special attention is paid to Christian modifications.
